## Community College District

Ohlone College is a two-year college that serves the cities of Fremont, Newark and Union City. Part of the California Community College system, Ohlone serves as a transfer institution to four-year colleges and universities. Ohlone ranks among the top ten out of all 112 community colleges in California for student success and completion and for transfer to universities. Ohlone also offers job training courses in high growth, high employment fields that help to build the economy in the Tri-City region.

Established in 1965, Ohlone is a single college district, with two campuses and a strong online presence. Ohlone is located in the southeast part of the San Francisco Bay Area, a part of the Silicon Valley which is known for its innovation.

Ohlone offers over 170 degrees and certificates and serves 16,000 students per year. Each year about 900 students transfer to four-year colleges and universities, and over 700 students graduate with associate degrees or earn vocational certificates. Ohlone College employs approximately 430 part-time and full-time faculty and 220 support and management personnel.
